

Course selection process

The Victorian Certificate of Education







What is it?



Senior secondary qualification



Administered by the VCAA (Victorian Curriculum Assessment Authority)



Two year certificate



Preparation for tertiary study



Each subject may be studied over four units, one per semester



How is it structured?



Year 11 Units 1 and 2



Year 12 Units 3 and 4



Maximum 23 units over two years



Every student completes an **ENGLISH** study in each of Year 11 and 12



How is it structured?



In Year 11 students undertake **five** other studies



In Year 12 students undertake an English and **four** other studies

A mathematics pathway through VCE is highly recommended



Typically, students do at least 1 Unit 1 – 4 sequence



Some students do two Math's Unit 1 – 4 sequences

Vocational Education & Training (VET)

are selected studies that

MUST

be included in a

VCE Vocational Major (VM) course

and CAN

be included in a VCE Course

(contributing to VCE ATAR score)

VET

What is it?



Vocational Education & Training (VET)



May result in a nationally recognised Certificate II or III qualification



Provides credit towards the VCE to different degrees



Additional costs on top of school fees may be applicable for certain studies

VET

What is it?



Vocational Education & Training (VET)



Some independent travel may be involved



Most VET classes held off-campus, but some at St Joseph's College



With a few exceptions (including: school-based VET studies) VET studies require an application form

VCE Vocational Major

(VCE VM)



a vocational and applied learning program within the VCE



designed to be completed over a minimum of two years



prepares students to move into apprenticeships, traineeships, further education and training, university (via non-ATAR pathways) or directly into the workforce.



No exams. No ATAR score. Assessments competency based.

Four days per week of school



2 VCE VM Work Related Skills units (most students will complete 4 units)



Personal Development

2 VCE VM Personal
Development Skills units (most students will complete four)




Students select their preferred program for 2023 VCE or VCE VM.






Students begin to select their preferences:
